THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Dear Parishioners.

The liturgy for this Sunday takes us first to a mountain top, a sacred spot where man could expect to encounter God, and then to the Sea of Galilee, water, over which man has no control, and whose power the Israelites tended to fear.

Elijah goes up to encounter his God. There is a wind so strong it crushes the rocks, the earth quakes, and there is fire (lightening perhaps?). But Elijah does not find God in the storm, but rather in "a tiny whispering sound" or, as it used to be expressed, in "a still small voice".

The apostles come up against a terrifying storm in the gospel. After testing Peter's faith, Jesus overpowers the sea and restores the calm; once again here is stillness. They need not have feared; they ought to have trusted in Christ's protection.

Most people look for God in spectacular and dramatic events; they try to hear him in clear words. But the Lord seems to prefer to address us through the ordinary things in life and to speak in a gentle voice that goes right to our hearts.


ST. VINCENT DE PAUL FOOD PANTRY


