

THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Dear Parishioners,

The gospel for this Sunday contains important advice for all of us. It is part of Jesus' discourse on order in the Church, and is sandwiched between the parable of the lost sheep and the answer to Peter's question about how often a disciple must forgive and the parable of the unforgiving servant. So Jesus is modeling how we should deal with someone who has gone astray.

I would highlight two things in this passage. The first is that we ought to go right to the person who has offended us or the community and discuss it with the person in private. The scriptures make it clear that we have a responsibility for those who have put themselves in danger. Yes, we are our brother's keeper! We are expected to warn them of the consequences of their actions, and to do so privately in order to avoid embarrassment or undo publicity. Only if we are not heard should we take the problem to a higher authority.

Secondly – and this is crucial – the offenders have put themselves outside the community like "a Gentile or a tax collector". But how did Jesus treat such people? He went after them to bring them back to the fold. He did not turn his back on them; he sought them out to bring them back to the flock. After all, he came for the "lost sheep of the house of Israel". He came that we might experience the power of forgiveness.


