

THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Dear Parishioners,

Way back in 1975 Pope Paul VI addressed an apostolic exhortation to the entire Church to remind us that the reason we exist as Church is to evangelize, to announce the gospel to the nations. Each of his successors, John Paul I, Benedict XVI, and Francis has taken up that same theme and called for a "New Evangelization" appropriate to these modern times.

Today, on "Mission Sunday", we will make a contribution to the Church's efforts in mission lands and perhaps say some prayers for the people who have dedicated their lives to that work. But I would suggest that we should hear a deeper call today, and ask ourselves what we are doing to help people understand the "good news" of the gospel and to respond to the call of Jesus Christ.

In his letter for this World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis returns to that theme of evangelization, and explains that before his Ascension the risen Jesus repeatedly told his disciples they were to be his witnesses. Notice Jesus said witness<u>es</u> (plural) – this is the work of the community, of the Church, and it is essential.

You and I believe because of the solid teaching and the inspiring example of others who have witnessed to us. What are you doing to keep that tradition of handing on the faith alive?




