

THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Dear Parishioners.

We realize that Our Lord, in response to the question about the greatest of the commandments, selected two mandates from the Old Testament, the first (Deuteronomy 6, 4) very well known, taken from the "Shema" which devout Jews prayed every morning, and the second less familiar from Leviticus 19, 18. What was original in this answer was that Jesus presented them as equally important.

You might wonder why our treatment of others, especially the aliens, orphans, widows, and neighbors in need mentioned in our reading from Exodus would weigh so heavily in God's eyes. But what father doesn't judge your love for him on how you respond to the children of his heart?

Love, biblical love, is not romance or emotion; it is very definitely a decision of the will to seek the well-being of the other. To love one's neighbor is to love someone God himself loves as a son or daughter.

A journalist was touring Ronald Reagan's beloved ranch in California and he wondered how Nancy would have taken to life there. His guide informed him: "She loved it because he loved it, and she loved him." In the final analysis that is the explanation for the second clause of the Great Commandment: we love our neighbors because God loves them, and we love God!

All teens are invited to join the Teen Club Friday evenings from 7:00 pm until 8:30 pm in the Parish Center Basement Meeting Room. All are welcome.




