

## THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

### Dear Parishioners,

The Good Shepherd is one of the oldest and most beloved images of Jesus. It draws on Moses and David, both of whom were shepherds before they accepted their missions from God. It rose up in the preaching of so many of the prophets, who accused the Jewish priests of failing to tend to the spiritual needs of the people of God. Ezechiel (chapter 34) promised that God himself would intervene and shepherd his neglected people, which he did in the person of Jesus. And on the walls of the catacombs, in our oldest Christian art, we can still see Jesus represented as a young shepherd shouldering a lamb.

It is my favorite picture of Jesus, deeply consoling in the description of the sacred scriptures, especially Psalm 23, but incredibly challenging as well. In this Sunday's gospel you heard Jesus say that he, the Good Shepherd, "**lays down his life** for the sheep". He meant that literally. The communal sheep pens of his day had no gate. One of the shepherds would lay down in the opening of the pen when the sheep came down from grazing on the hillsides, and his body was the only thing that stood between predators (wolves, lions, bears) and the sheep which were such easy prey.


Of course, Jesus is also referring to his death on the cross, where he consented to his suffering and death. As he says, no one took his life from him; he gave it ... for his sheep ... for us. Anyone who follows him in ministry is expected to do the same, to put the needs of the people ahead of his or her own. Every morning I ask St. Jean Marie Vianney, patron of parish priests, to give us priests, holy priests, men who are willing to lay down their lives for their flock.
