THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE

Dear Parishioners,

Our focus at the Epiphany tends to be on the magi, those exotic visitors, and their expensive gifts. LIVING LITURGY, provided information about the gifts that I thought was interesting enough to share with you.

Gold was a gift fitting for a king, for one with power and authority; it was also a symbol of divinity. The child before whom the magi prostrated themselves in an act of homage was, we know, King of Kings and Son of God. In his ministry he would challenge his followers to reevaluate their idea of wealth and to treasure the things of God.

Frankincense was a resin that was hardened and was used as a medicine: to stop bleeding and heal wounds, as an antidote for poison, and as a salve for bruises, ulcerations, and paralyzed limbs. This child would grow up to heal physical ailments, fears and doubts, and to bridge divisions.

Myrrh too was a resin, and an expensive one. It was used in embalming, and only royalty and the very wealthy could be embalmed. It too was a gift for a king. The child was destined to die to bring forth life for the world.

As in St. Luke's infancy narrative, we can see in this scene from St. Matthew's gospel, many themes that will resound throughout his entire gospel.

FEAST OF THE EPHIPHANY OF THE LORD

Sunday, January 8TH, 2018

... Epiphany comes from a Greek verb meaning "to reveal," and all of the various events celebrated by the Feast of the Epiphany are revelations of Christ to man...

Epiphany originally celebrated four different events, in the following order of importance: the Baptism of the Lord; Christ's first miracle, the changing of water into wine at the wedding in Cana; the Nativity of Christ; and the visitation of the Wise Men or Magi. Each of these is a revelation of God to man: At Christ's Baptism, the Holy Spirit descends and the voice of God the Father is heard, declaring that Jesus is His Son; at the wedding in Cana, the miracle reveals Christ's divinity; at the Nativity, the angels bear witness to Christ, and the shepherds, representing the people of Israel, bow down before Him; and at the visitation of the Magi, Christ's divinity is revealed to the Gentiles—the other nations of the earth.

Eventually, the celebration of the Nativity was separated out, in the West, into Christmas; and shortly thereafter, Western Christians adopted the Eastern feast of the Epiphany, still celebrating the Baptism, the first miracle, and the visit from the Wise Men. Thus, Epiphany came to mark the end of Christmastide—the Twelve Days of Christmas, which began with the revelation of Christ to Israel in His Birth and ended with the revelation of Christ to the Gentiles at Epiphany...

FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

Monday, January 8TH, 2018

At first glance, the Baptism of the Lord might seem an odd feast. Since the Catholic Church teaches that the Sacrament of Baptism is necessary for the remission of sins, particularly Original Sin, why was Christ baptized? After all, He was born without Original Sin, and He lived His entire life without sinning. Therefore, He had no need of the sacrament, as we do. In submitting Himself humbly to the baptism of St. John the Baptist, however, Christ provided the example for the rest of us. If even He should be baptized, though He had no need of it, how much more should the rest of us be thankful for this sacrament, which frees us from the darkness of sin and incorporates us into the Church, the life of Christ on earth! His Baptism, therefore, was necessary—not for Him, but for us.
