

As St. John best models for us the behavior one would expect from a beloved disciple during the time of his Master's suffering, resting his head on the Lord's breast during the Last Supper and standing with Mary at the foot of the

cross, so too does he lead the way for us on Easter morning. Of all those who peered into the empty tomb and saw just Jesus' burial cloths left behind, John alone understood its significance, for he tells us "he saw and believed."

While thousands today will see our churches decorated with bright banners and spring flowers, will hear joyful songs, and will profess their belief, how many will grasp the meaning of the earth-shaking event that we commemorate? Every Sunday we profess to believe that "on the third day" Jesus, crucified, dead, and buried, "rose again from the dead" and that we will experience "the resurrection of the body and life everlasting."

This is the most significant news in all of history! By rising Jesus defeated our ancient enemies, sin, suffering, and death. By reconciling his apostles and commissioning them to forgive sins in his name on that first Easter night, he extended the fruit of that victory to us. He changed the world; he gave us hope.

HAPPY EASTER!

Easter is the greatest feast in the Christian calendar.

On this Sunday, Christians celebrate the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead.

For Catholics, Easter Sunday comes at the end of 40 day(s) of **prayer**, **fasting**, and almsgiving known as **Lent**. Through spiritual struggle and self-denial, we have prepared ourselves to die spiritually with Christ on **Good Friday**, the day of His Crucifixion, so that we can rise again with Him in new life on Easter....

The Fulfillment of Our Faith

Easter is a day of celebration because it represents the fulfillment of our faith as Christians. St. Paul wrote that, unless Christ rose from the dead, our faith is in vain (1 Corinthians 15:17). Through his death, Christ saved mankind from bondage to sin, and He destroyed the hold that death has on all of us; but it is His Resurrection that gives us the promise of new life, both in this world and the next.

The Coming of the Kingdom

That new life began on Easter Sunday. In the **Our Father**, we pray that "Thy Kingdom come, on earth as it is in Heaven." And Christ told His disciples that some of them would not die until they saw the Kingdom of God "coming in power" (Mark 9:1). The early Christian Fathers saw Easter as the fulfillment of that promise. With the resurrection of Christ, God's Kingdom is established on earth, in the form of the Church.
